Background

Located in rural southern Middle Tennessee, Lawrence County School System (LCSS) is dedicated to preparing its students for career success. As career opportunities increasingly include remote and hybrid work arrangements, the Lawrence County Chamber identified the need for remote worker certification in the area.

Solution



LCSS partnered with Workplaceless to provide the Remote Work Certification to high school students enrolled in Career and Technical Education classes.

Results & Impact

The Department of Career and Technical Education (CTE) now offers the Workplaceless Remote Work Certification program to students at Lawrence County High School, Summertown High School, and Loretto High School.

Shannon Watson, Director of LCSS CTE, stated that given the increasing adoption of flexible work, "the addition of a Remote Worker Certification seemed not only relevant but a necessary step to prepare students for the ever-changing world of work."
